# Five Ways To Get Involved

There are numerous ways to investigate the organizations that interest you.

Here are a few suggestions....

1. **Call or drop by the Office for Campus Life.** Each organization registers the name of a contact person and email address interested students can get more information about joining the group. The telephone number of the office is 617-627-3212, and it is on the first floor of the Mayer Campus Center.
2. **Look and listen for advertisements all over campus.** Organizations post fliers, place table tents in the dining halls, and chalk on the sidewalks. Events can be advertised through campus media, such as The Tufts Daily and Tuftslife.com. Some organizations advertise better than others; just because you haven't heard any news about a particular group doesn't mean it isn't active. Don't be discouraged; take it upon yourself to track them down!
3. **Attend the Student Activities Fairs** in September and January. These events will give you the opportunity to meet and talk with representatives from various groups. This year's fall fair will be on September 8 from 5-7 p.m.
4. **Start a new student organization.** To start this process, visit the Office for Campus Life and pick up a New Club/Organization Registration Form, then ask for an appointment at one of our weekly New Organization Information Meetings with the Director of Campus Life.
5. **Talk to other students.** Ask people at events how you can join their groups. Remember, anyone can join any organization.

*Remember that while it is easy to join organizations at Tufts, taking the first step is up to you.*
